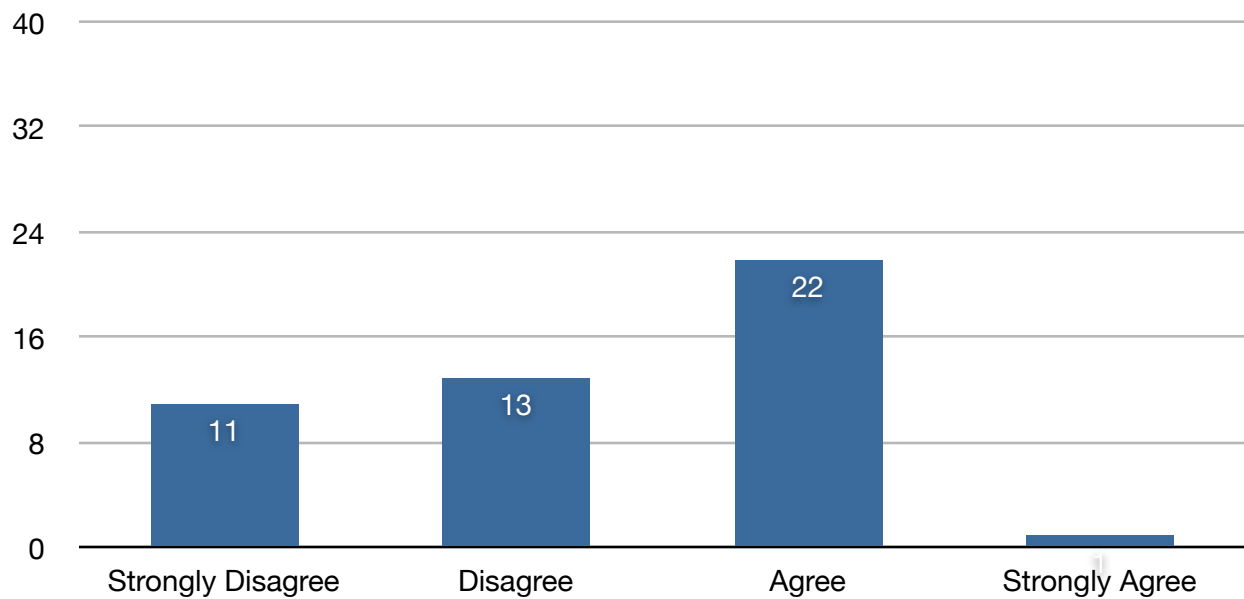

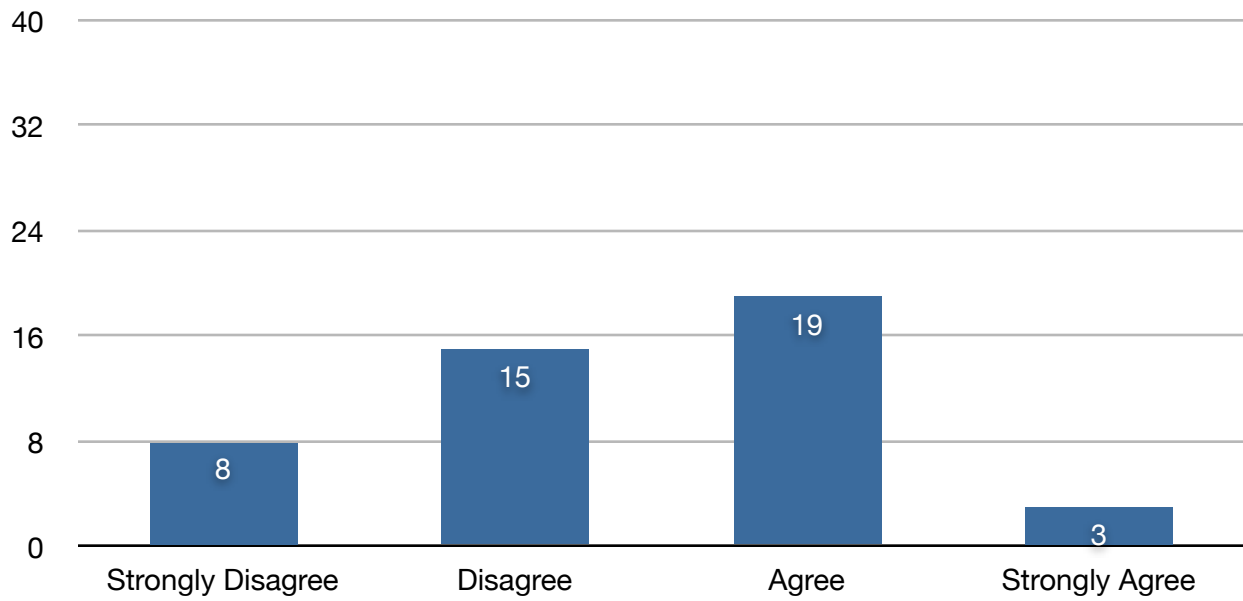
Section 1: School Relationships and Culture

12 Questions

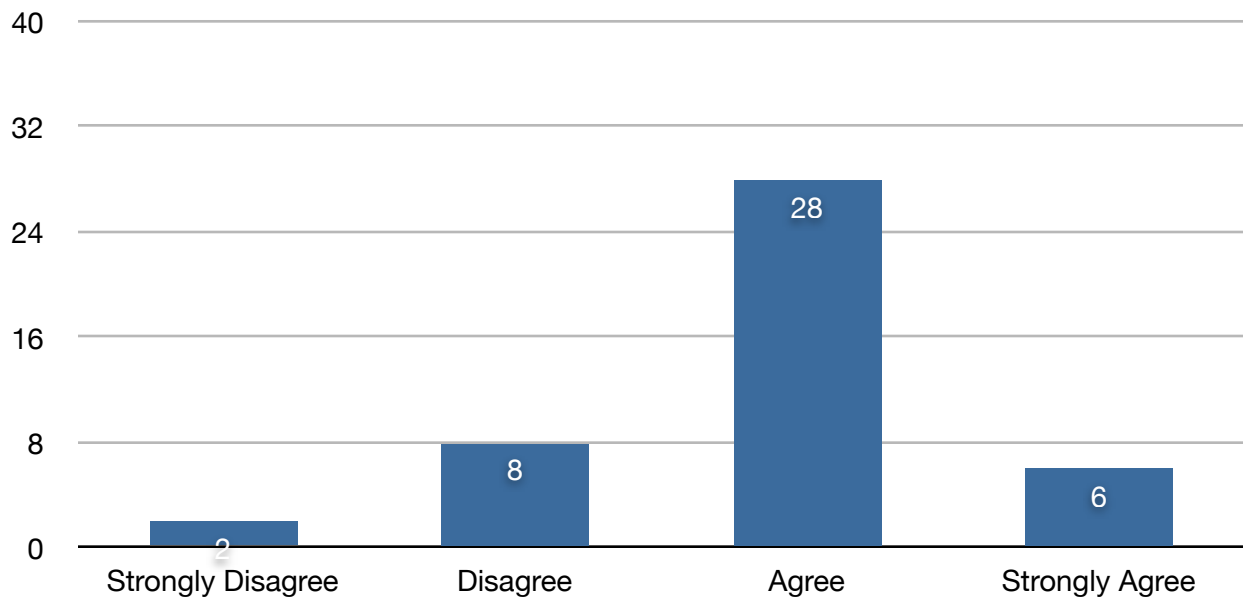
Q1: Teachers and principals listen to and consider student concerns and suggestions.



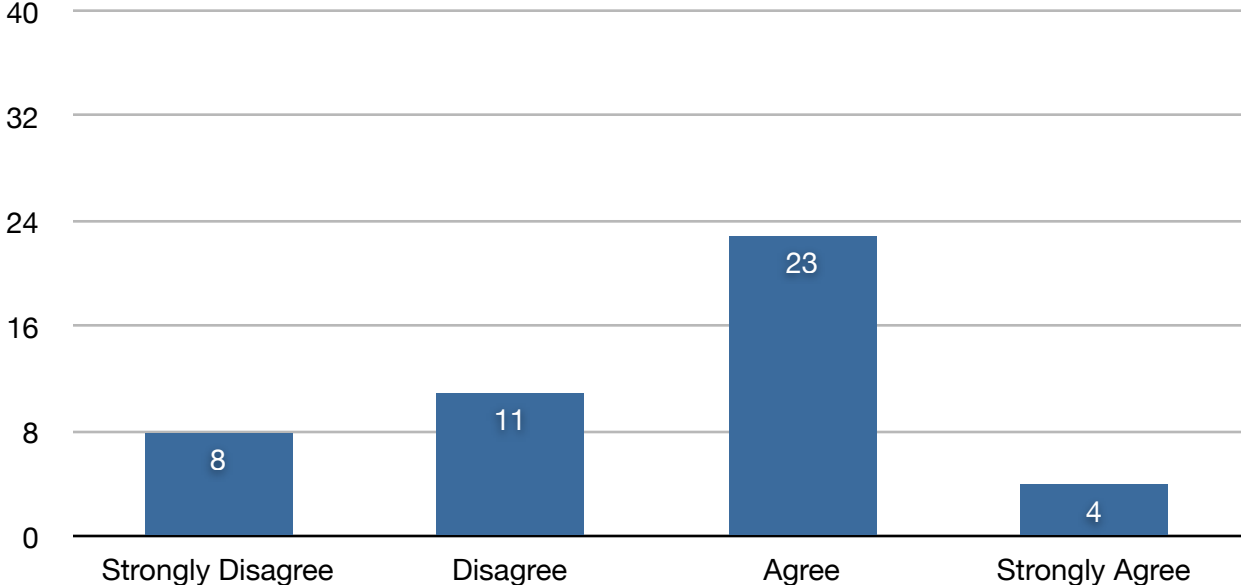
Q2: Bullying and harassment are effectively addressed in our schools.



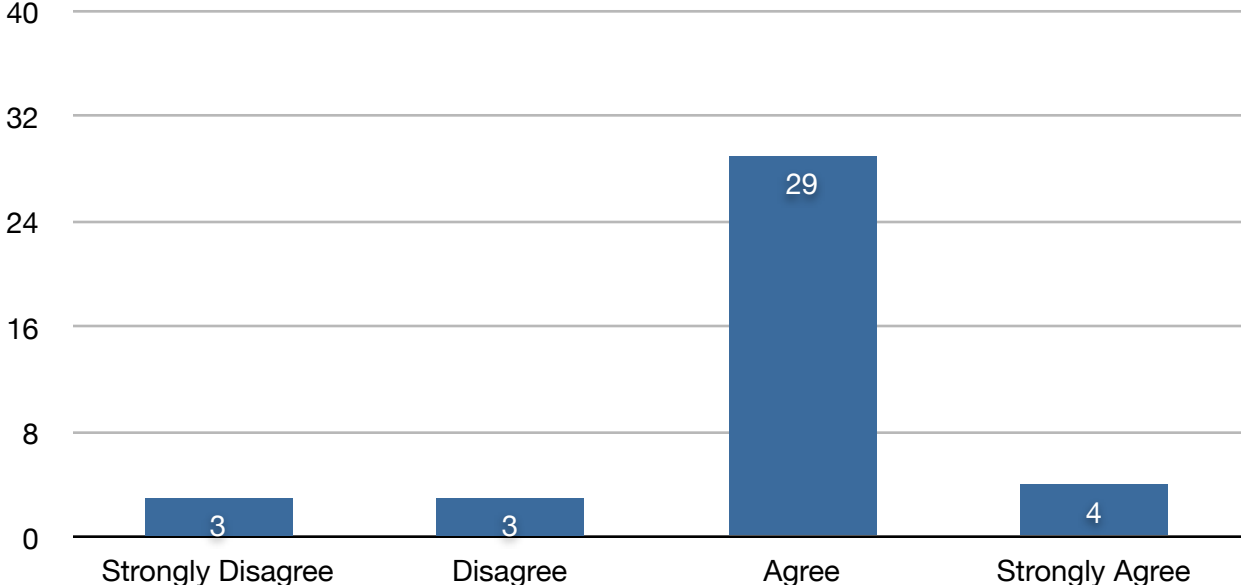
Q3: Teachers and principals clearly explain handbook regulations i.e. attendance, cell phones, and classroom rules, etc.



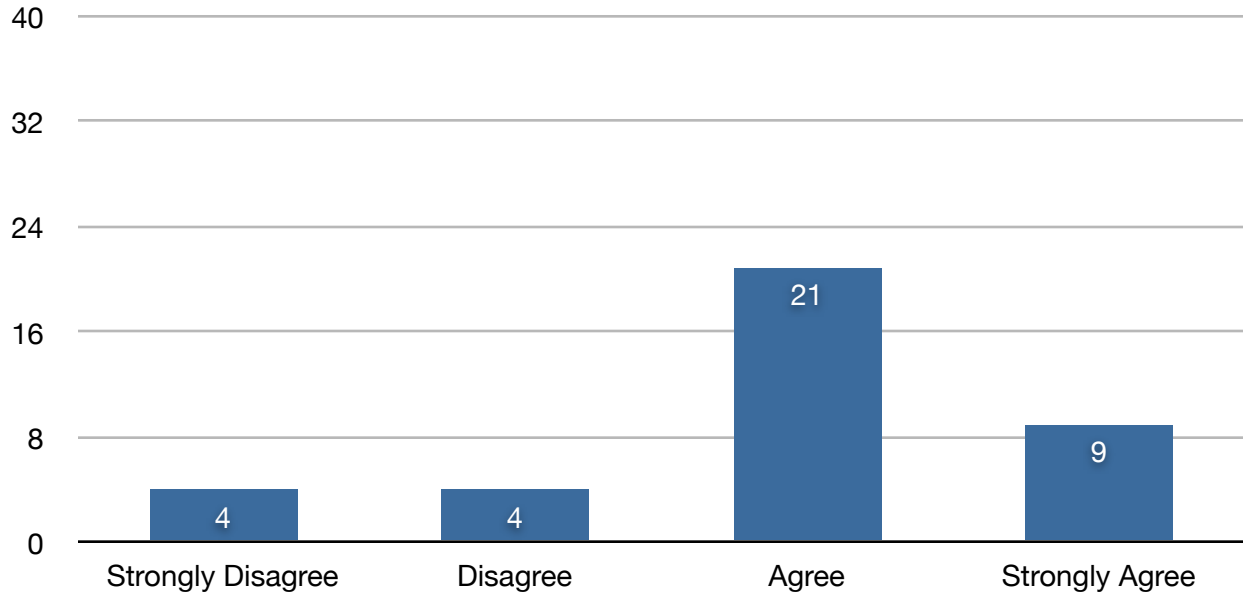
Q4: Teachers and principals fairly enforce handbook regulations i.e. attendance, cell phones, and classroom rules, etc.



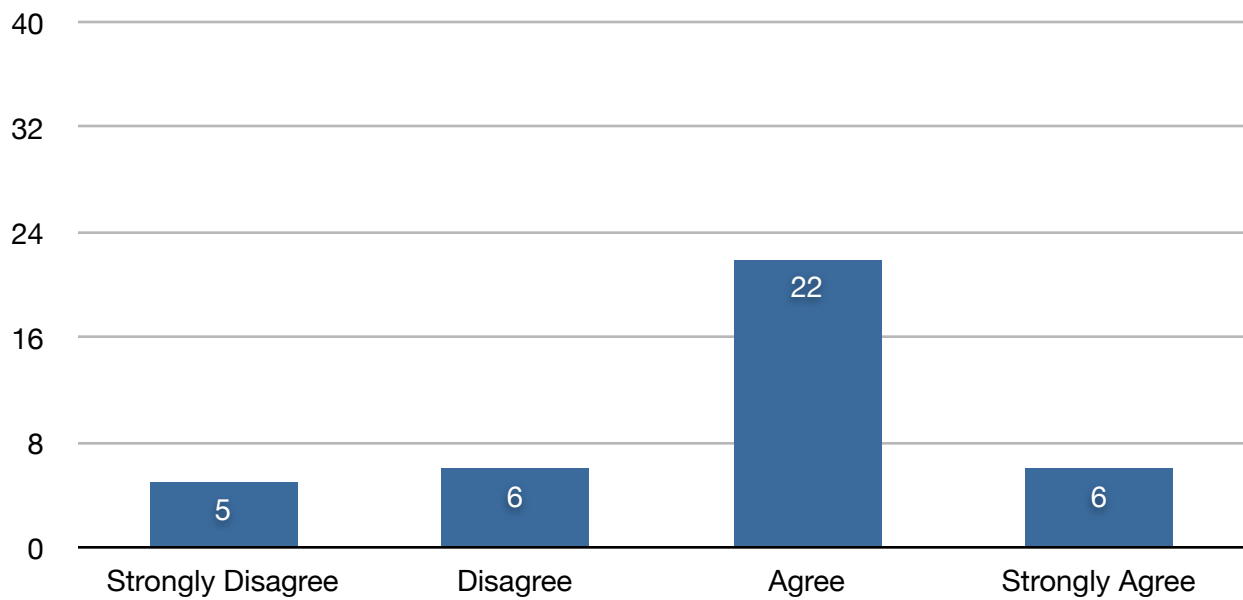
Q5: I have good relationships with my teachers.



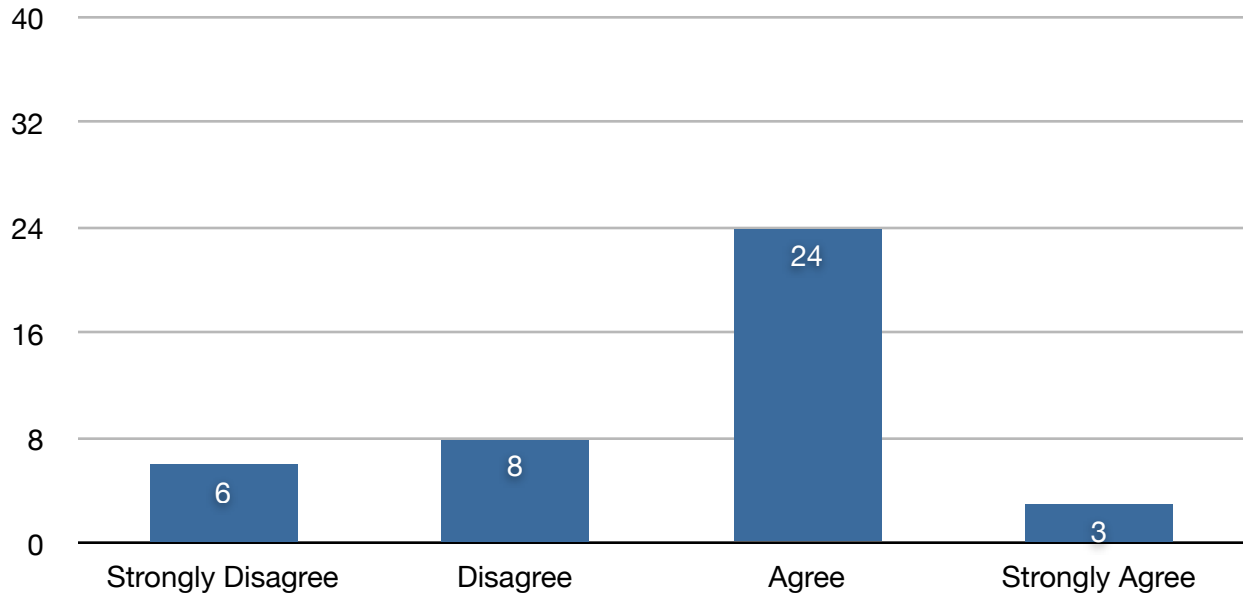
Q6: I can access my advisor when I need to.



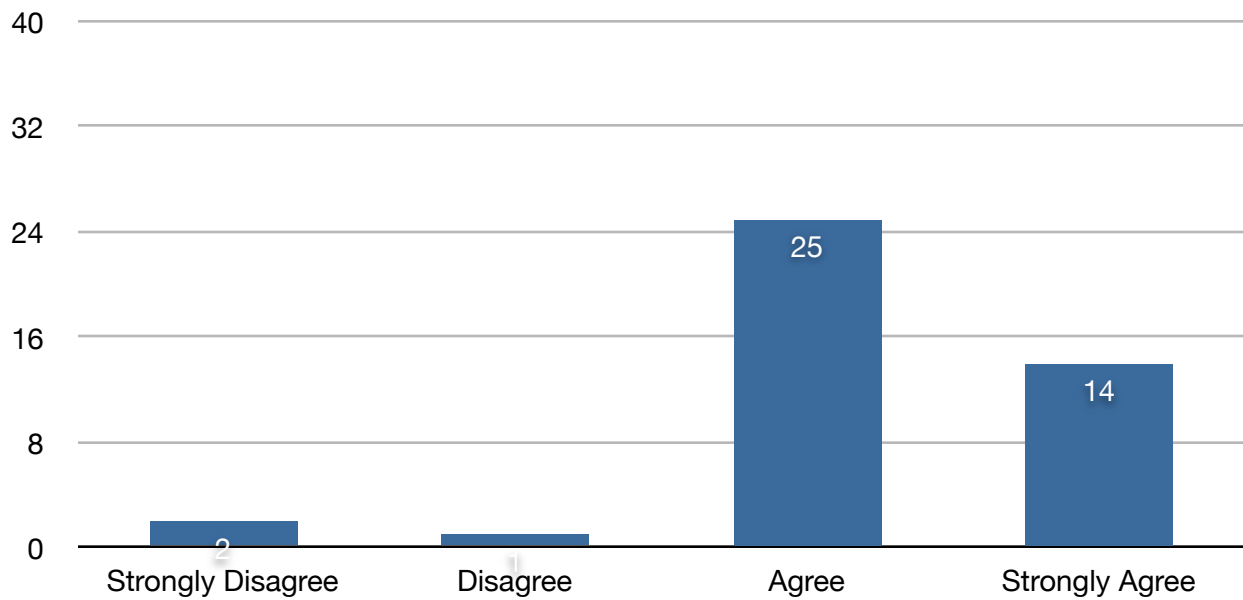

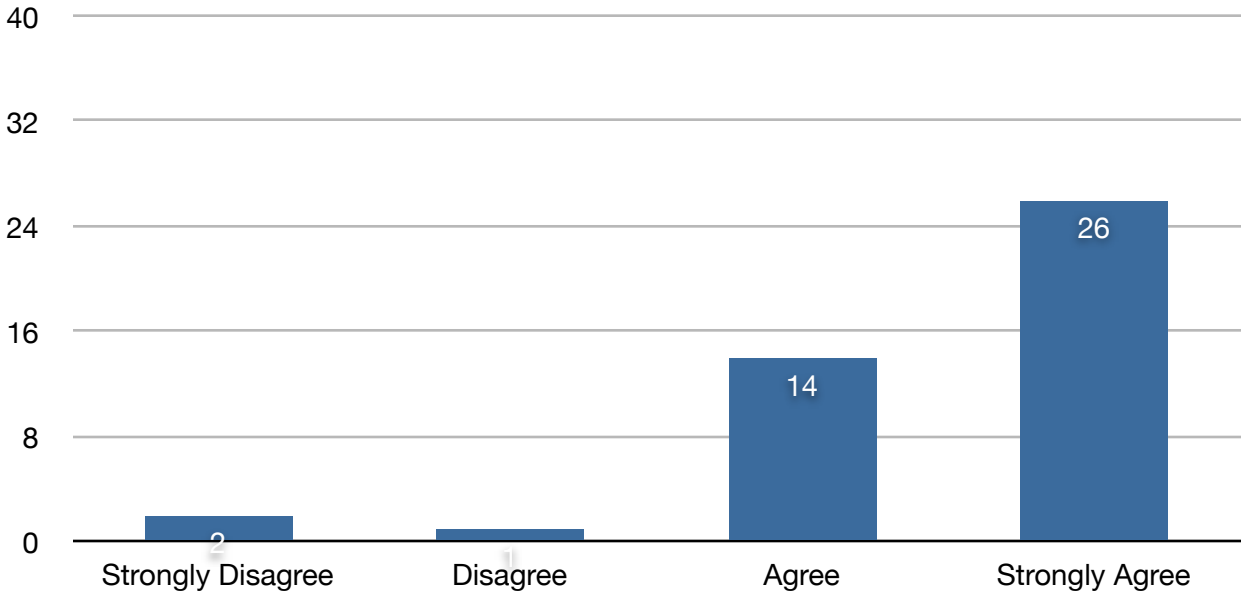

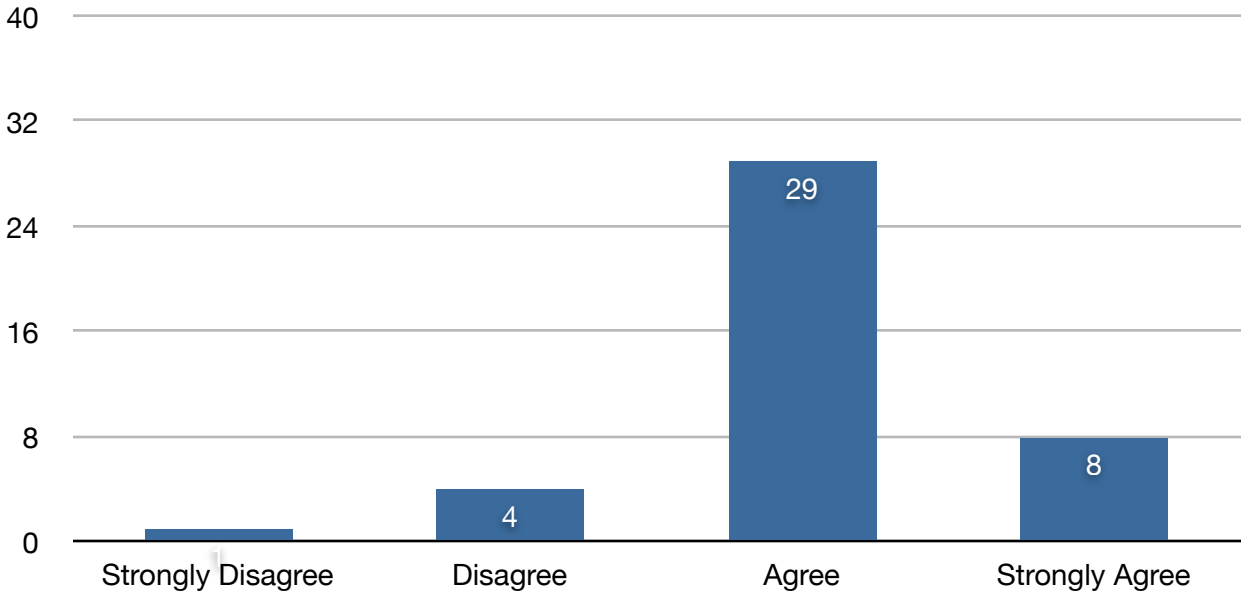
Q9: I have adequate access to my grades and other school information on our district webpage.



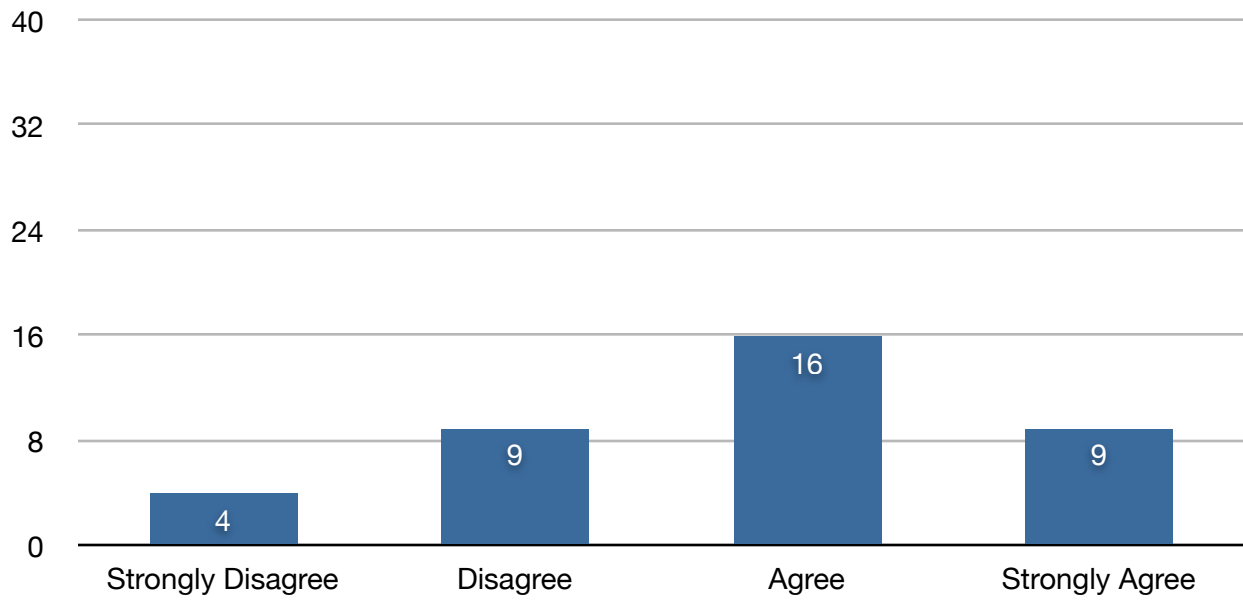
Q10: I regularly use my study hall and advisor period to complete homework assignments and/or access help from my teachers/advisors.



Q11: I have adequate access to technology to receive and complete course requirements.



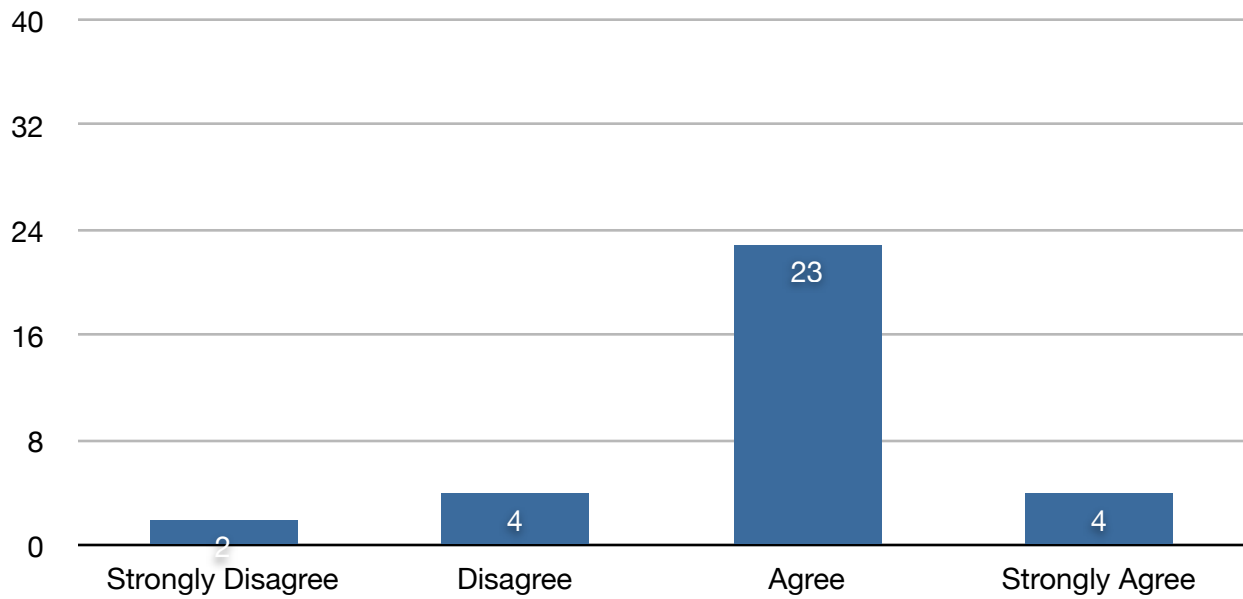

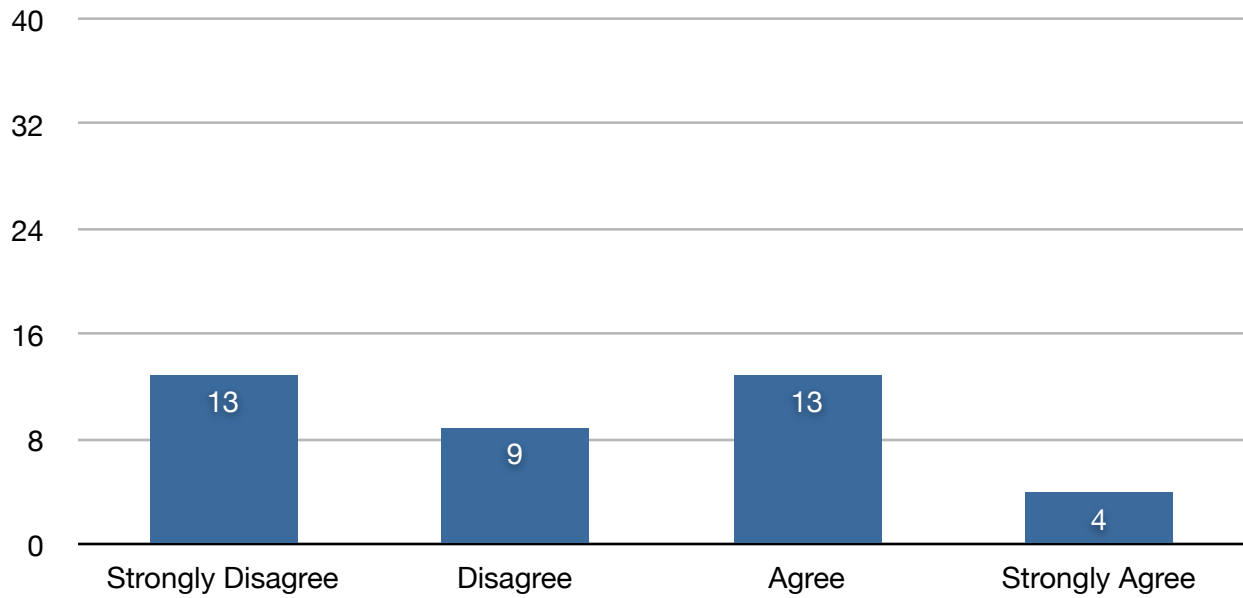

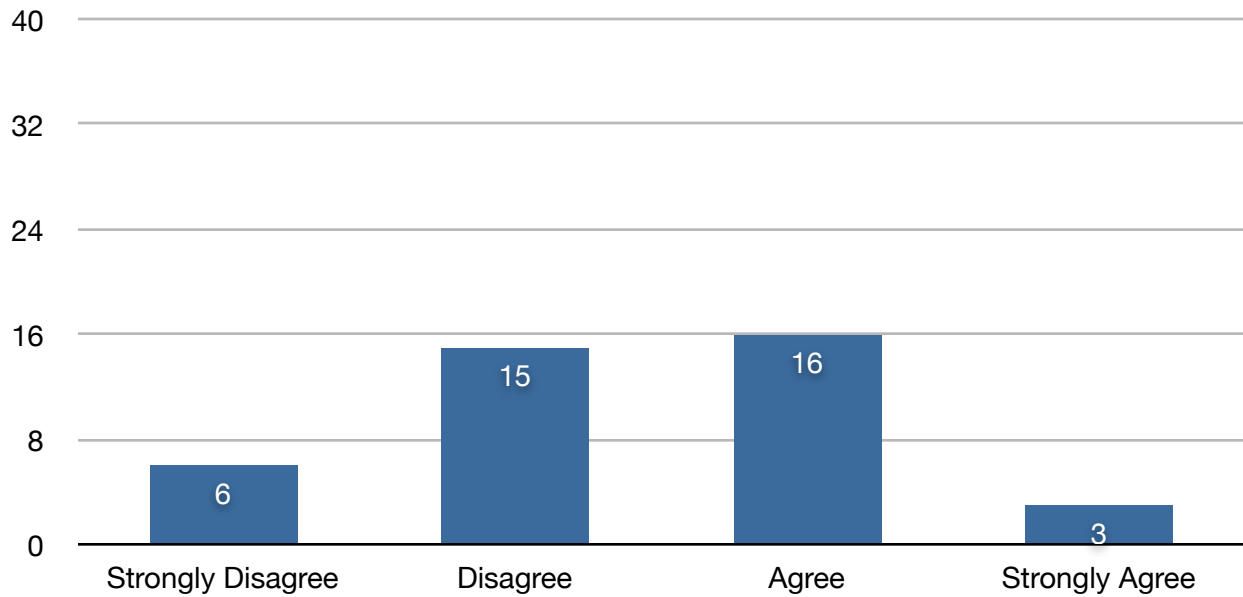
Q13: The current class schedules accommodate the needs of distance education students in both the four-day and five-day schools.



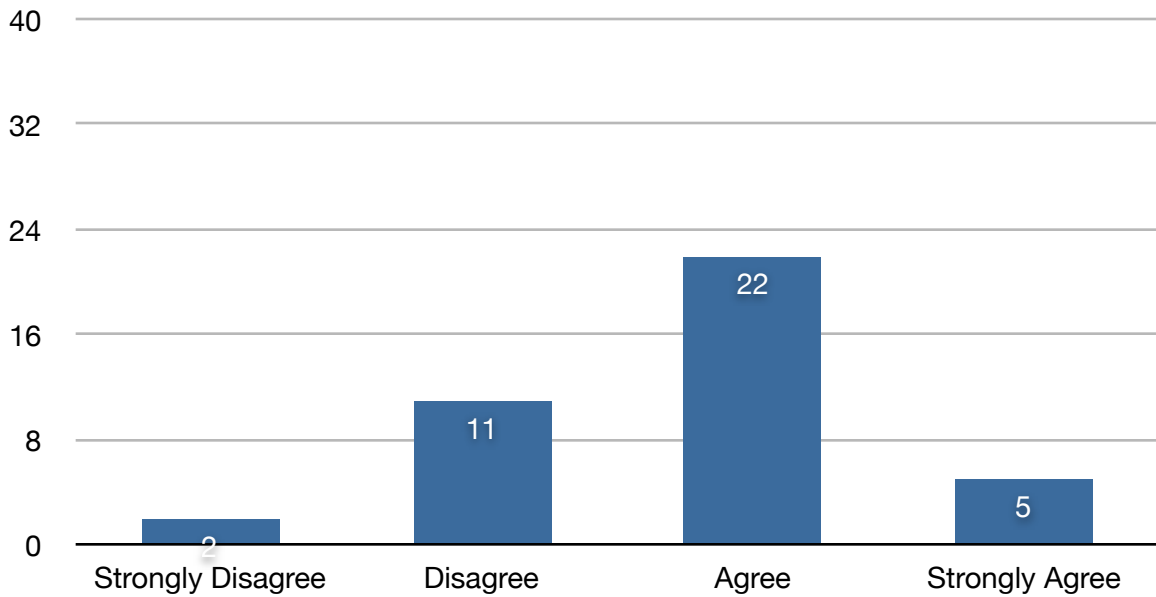
Q14: Inappropriate student behavior in distance learning classrooms is addressed in the same way it is in the traditional classroom.



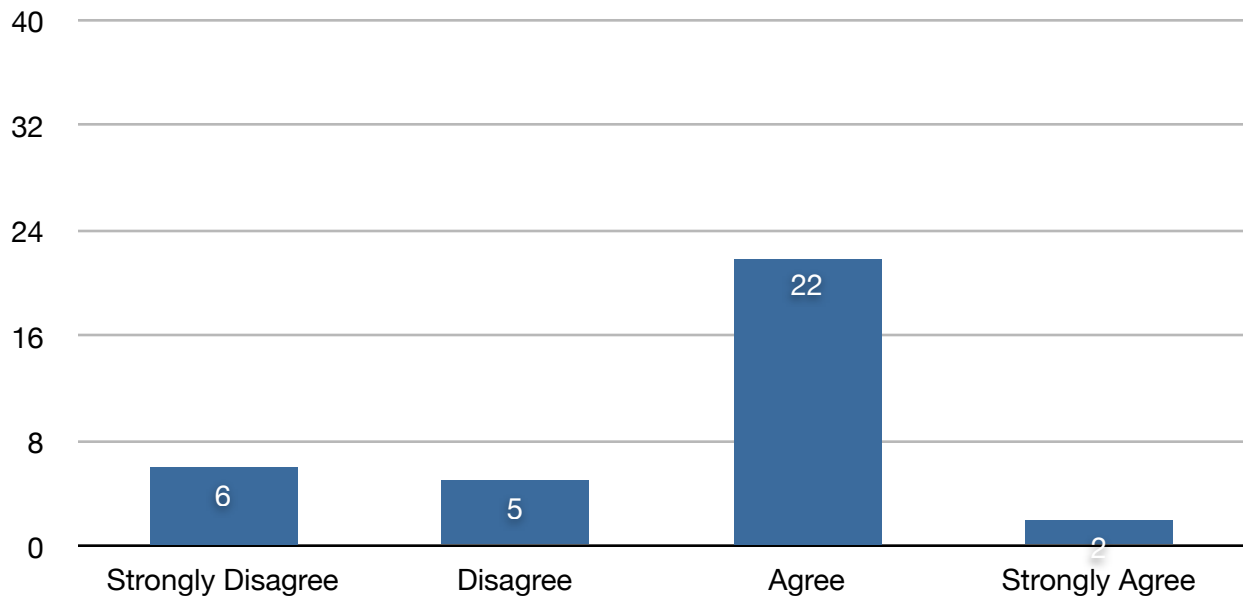
Q15: Students respect para-educators in the distance education classrooms.



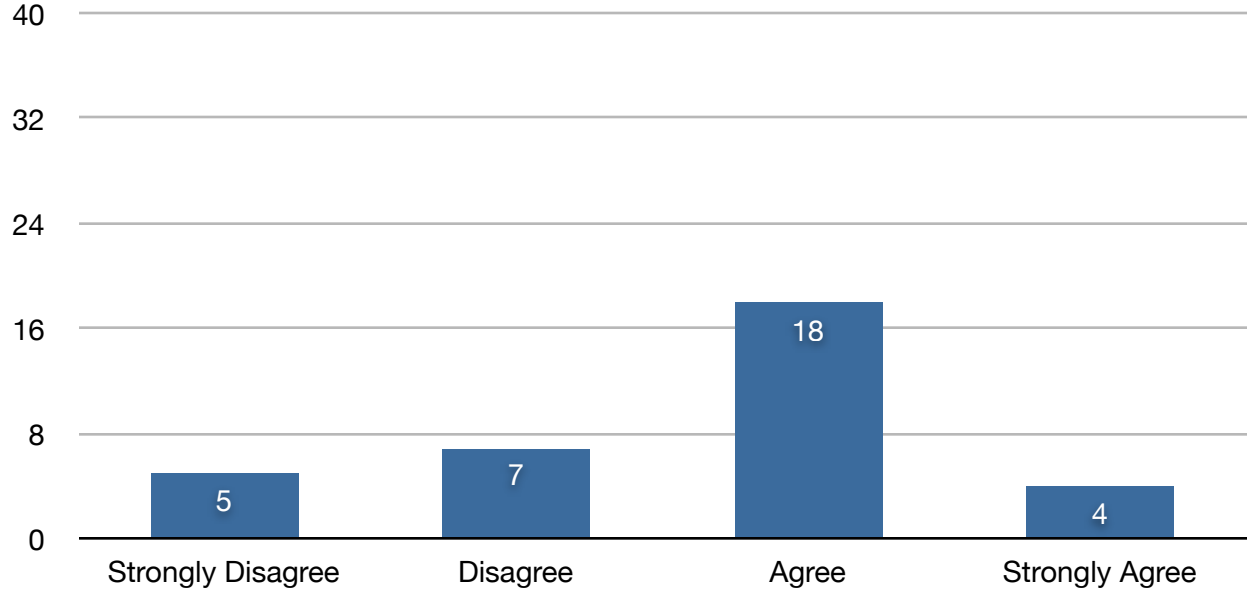
Q16: Students in distance learning classes receive materials and complete assignments in a timely manner.



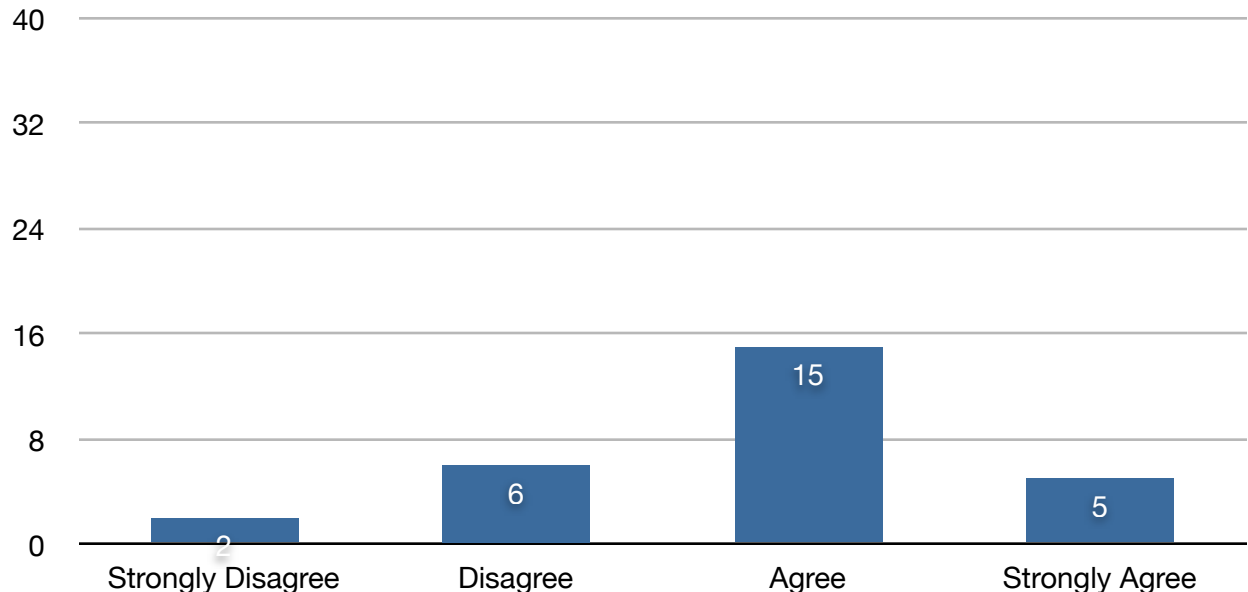
Q17: My learning in the distance-learning classroom is comparable to learning in the traditional classroom.



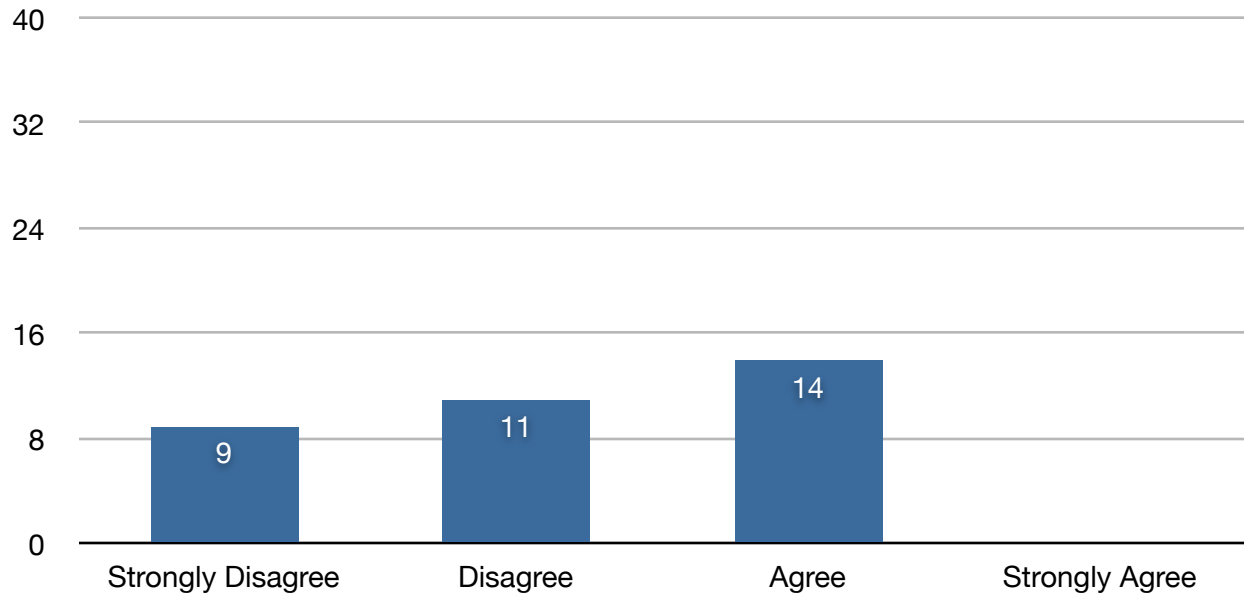
Q18: My distance education teachers use the mylearning online system to send and receive course materials.

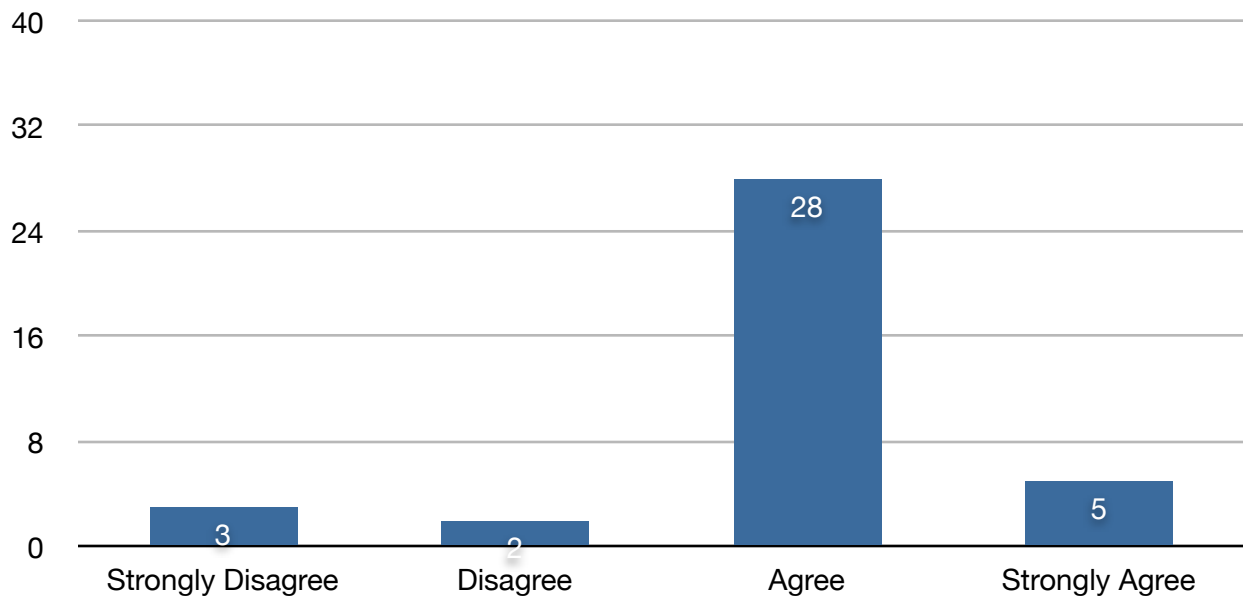
Q20: In distance learning classes, students at the receiving site receive the same attention from the teachers as the students in the sending site.



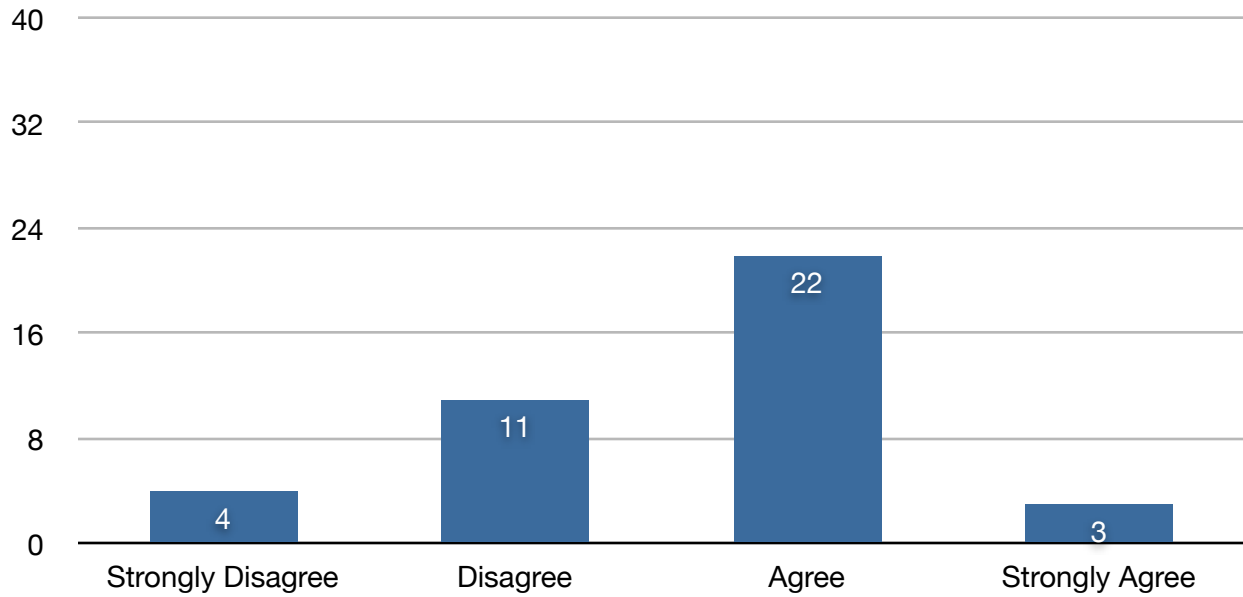

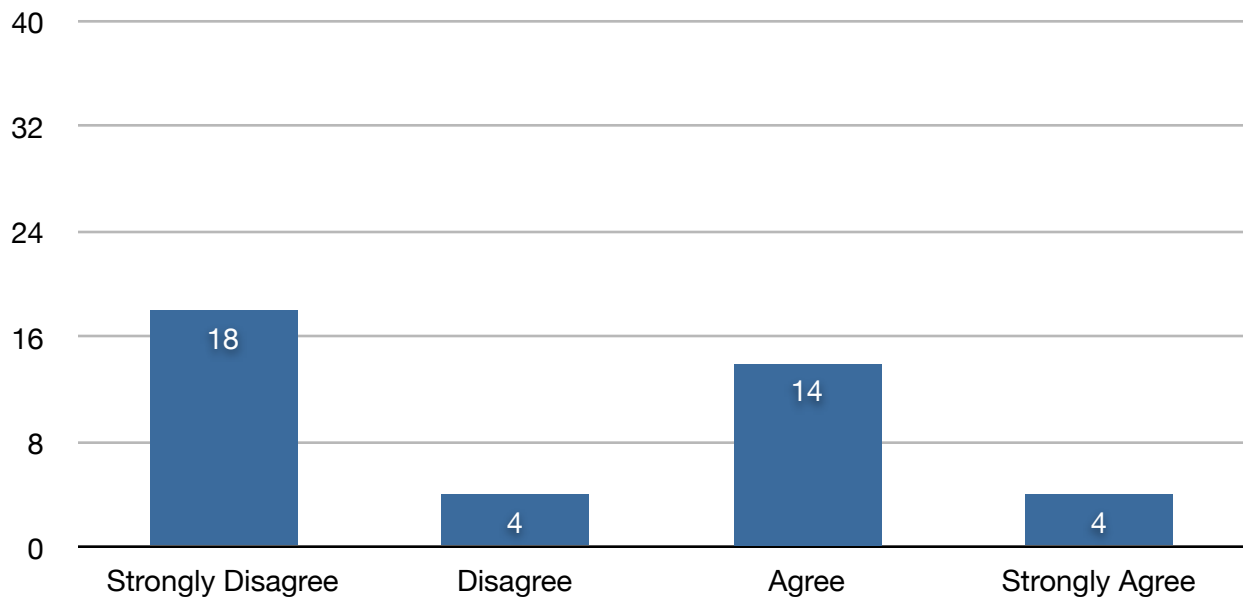
Q21: I feel like I'm getting the education I need to succeed in the 21st Century.
