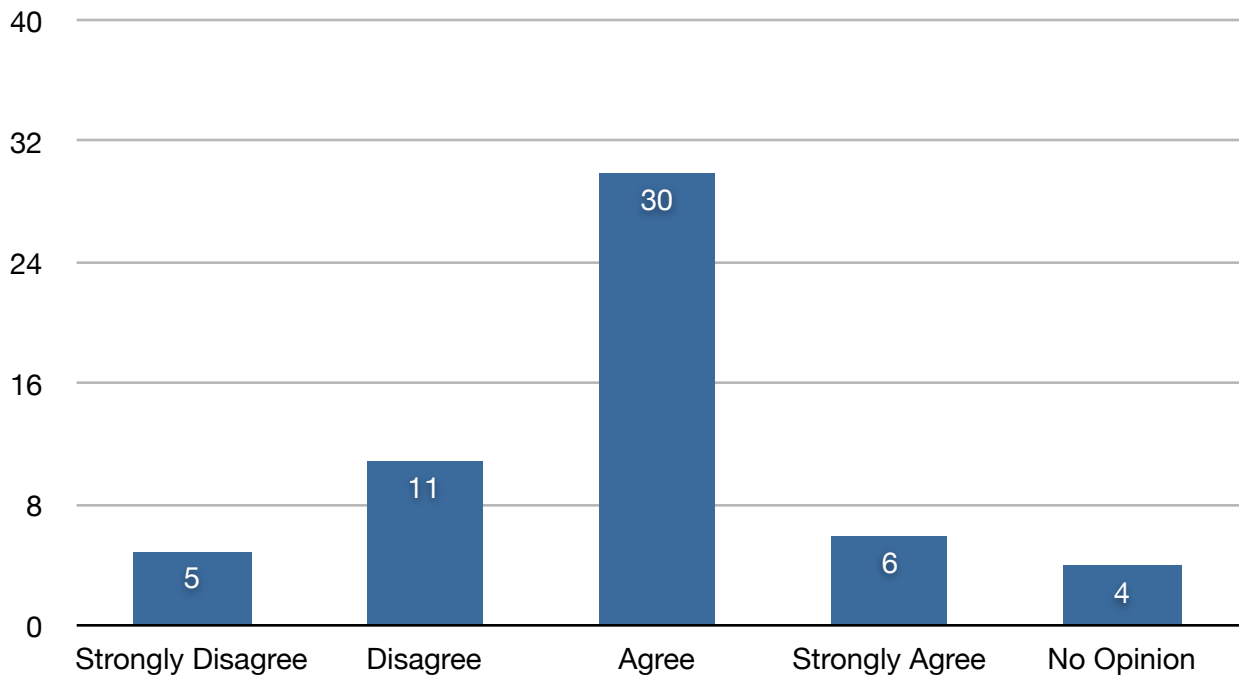
Q2: I trust school administrators to listen to and consider parent concerns and suggestions.



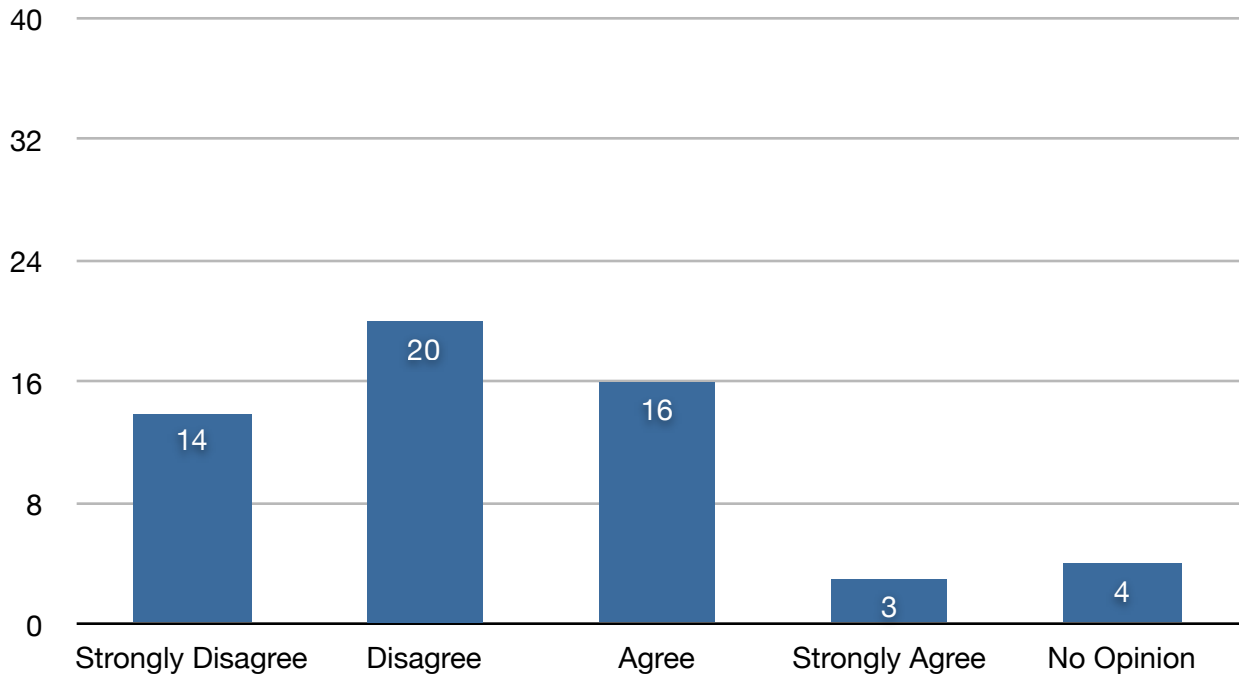

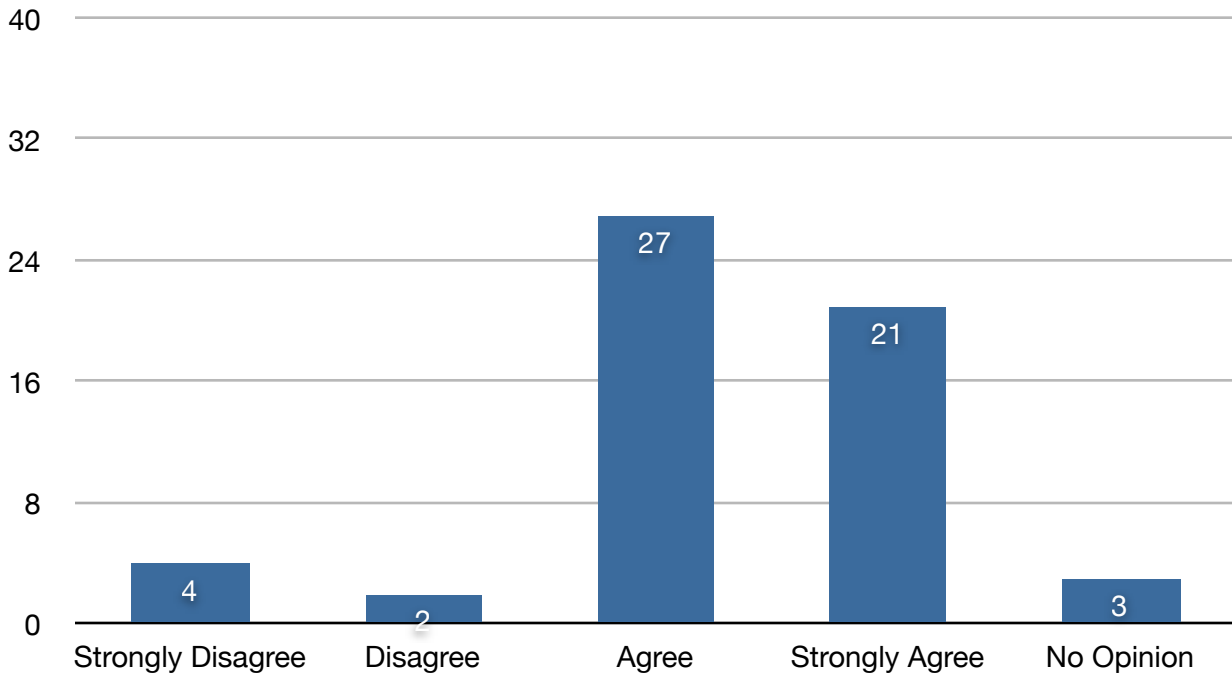

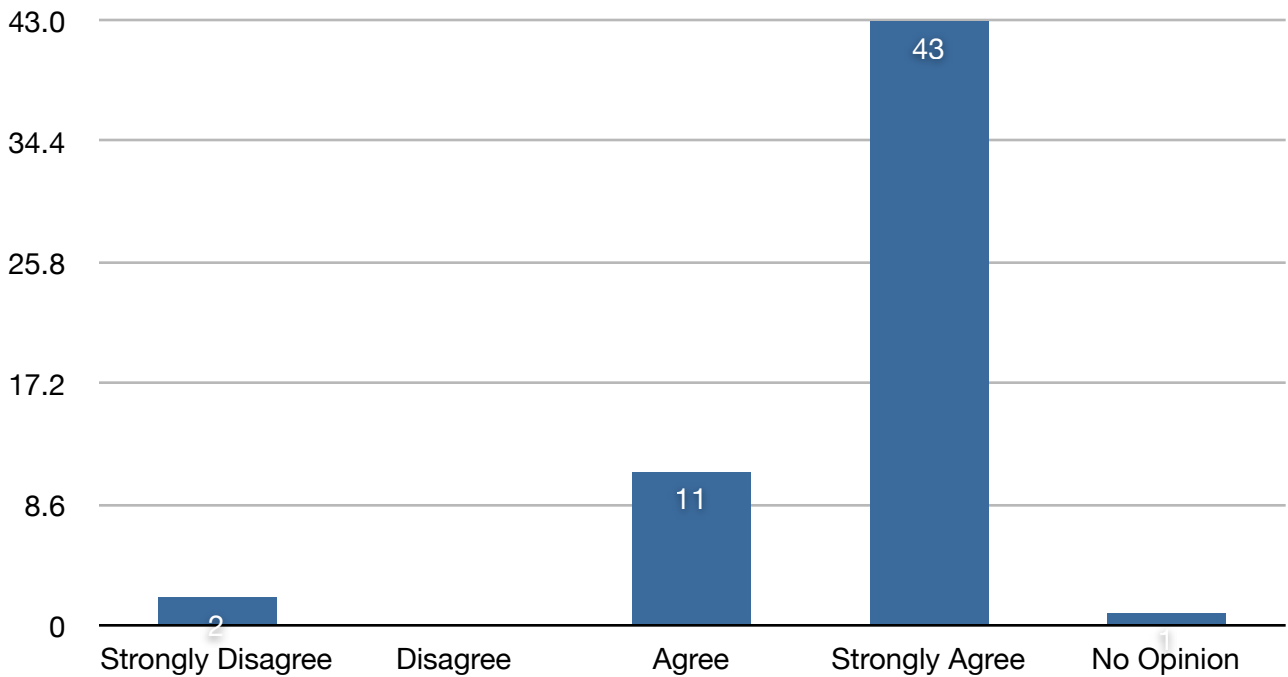

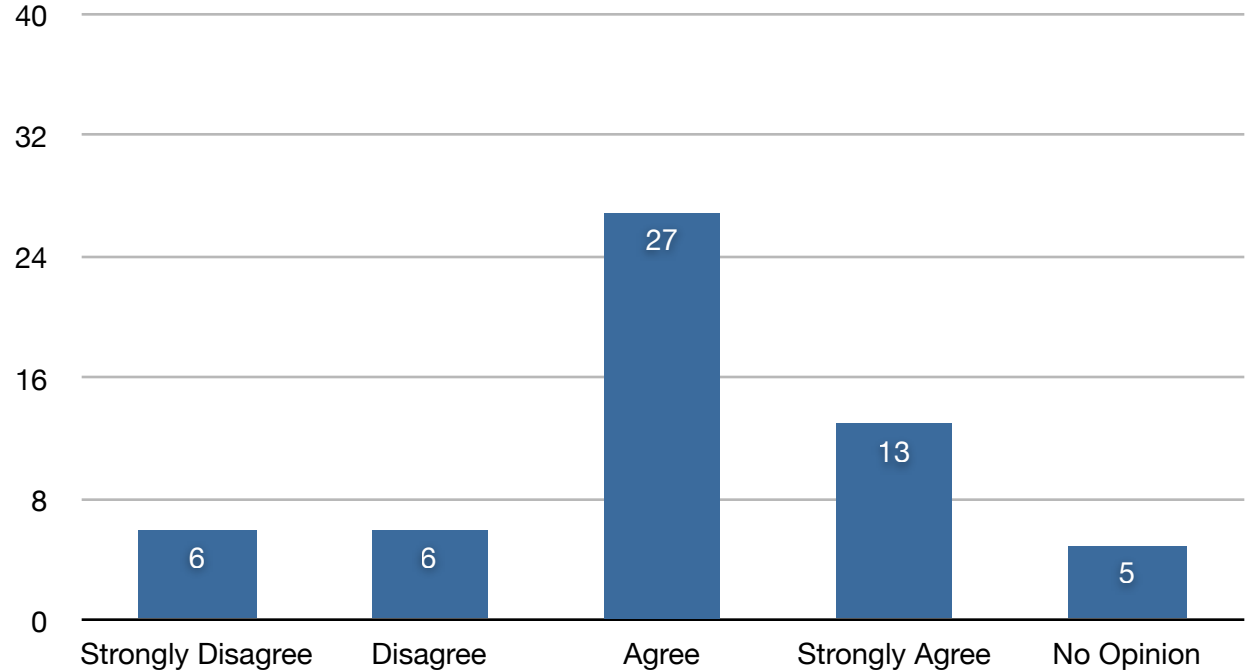
Q13: My child's learning in the distance learning classroom is comparable to his/her learning in the traditional classroom.



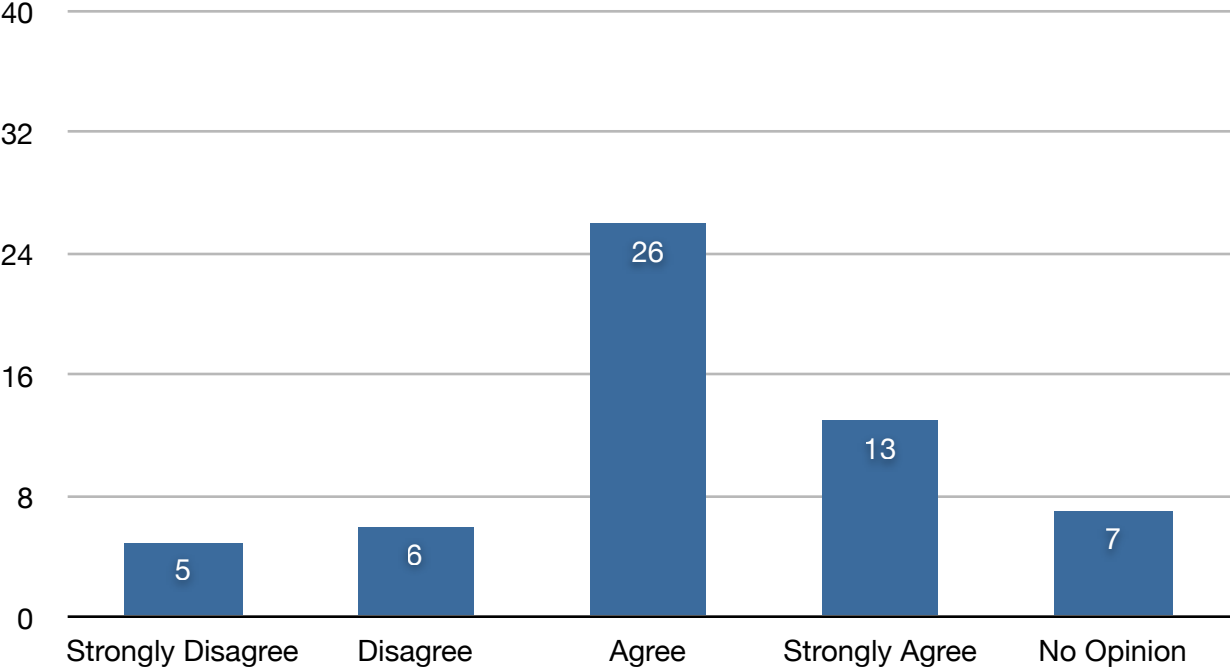

Q15: The four-school partnership improves financial security and increased educational opportunities, while respecting individual district interests.



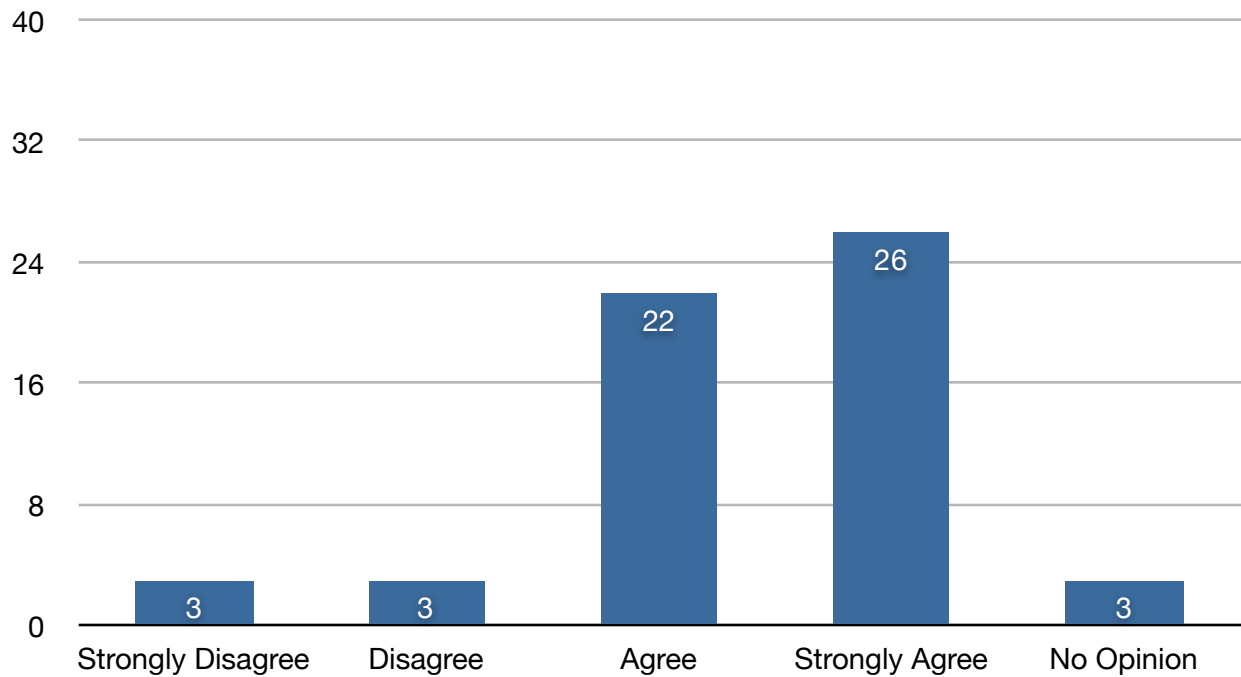

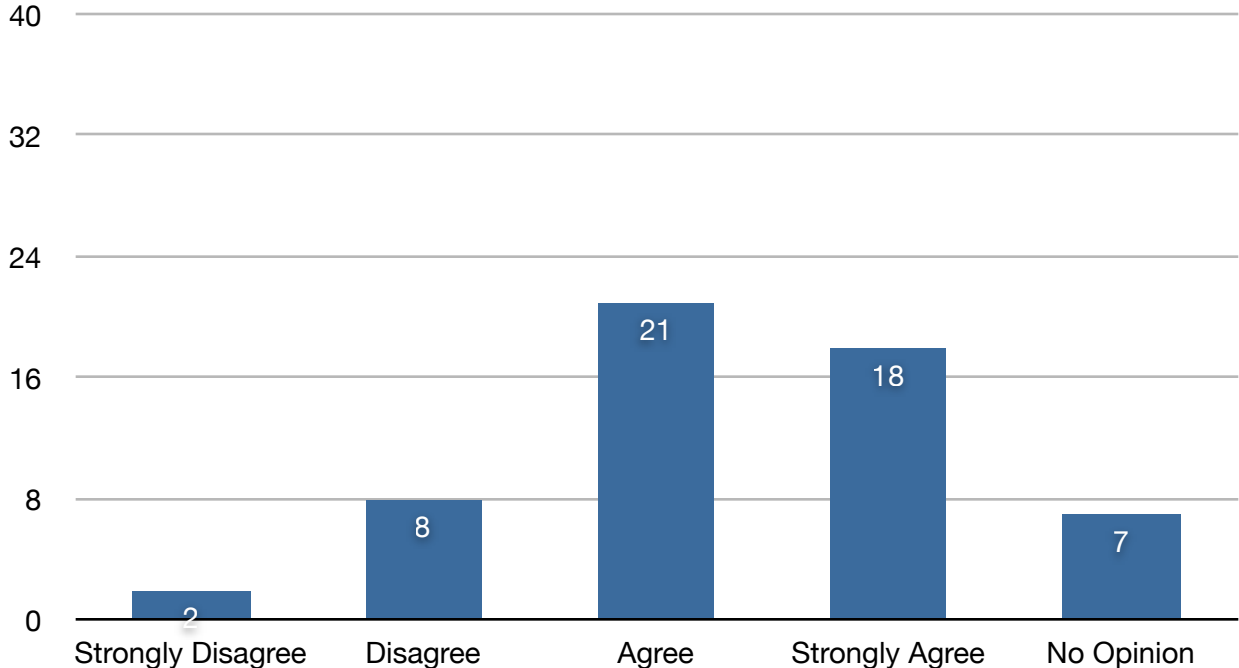
Q18: I believe our students are getting the education they need to prepare them to succeed in the 21st Century.



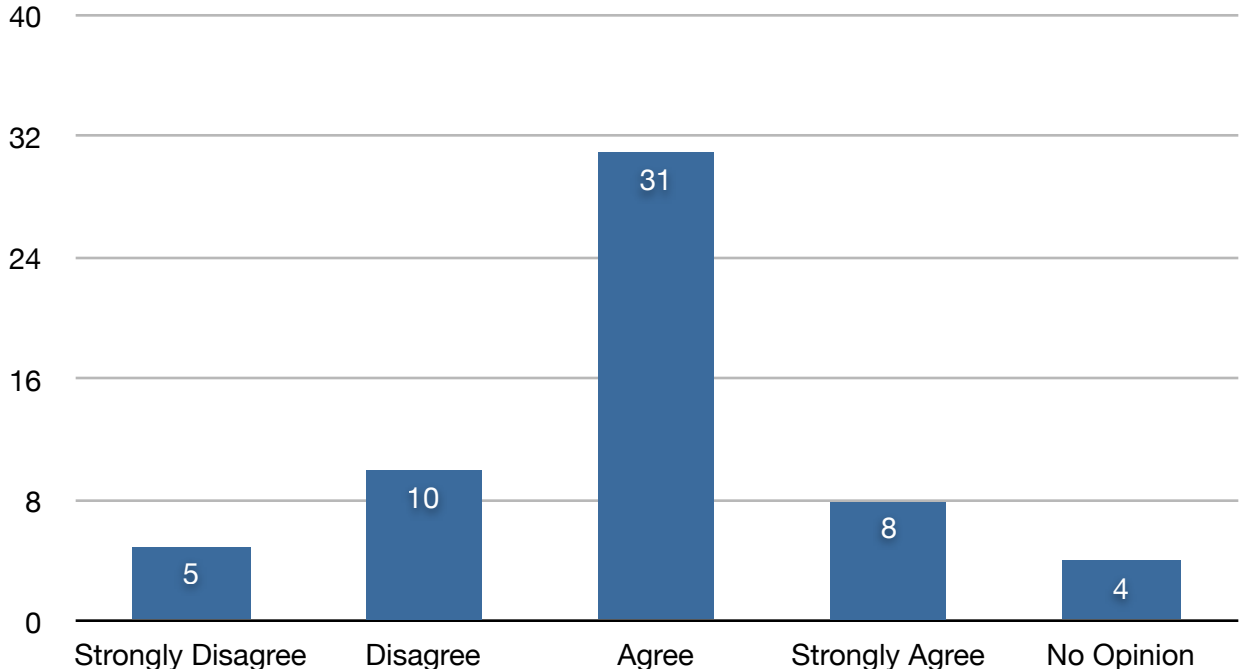
Q19: School is helping my child make connections to the community and transition to adulthood.
